As we near the end of an outstanding 2016-2017 school year, we would like to reemphasize the importance of school expectations.

- Students will continue to follow all school rules.

To ensure that our students have every opportunity to be successful in school, we request your continued support, assistance and commitment to making sure your student attends school on time five days a week.
